Program Admission Requirements

Students must meet the following requirements for admission to the program:

- At least 12 college-level credits/units with a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher
- Completion of ENGL& 101 (<https://catalog.clark.edu/search/?P=ENGL%26%20101>) with a grade B+ or higher
- Eligibility for enrollment in MATH 96 (<https://catalog.clark.edu/search/?P=MATH%2096>) or higher

Transfer AA Honors Concentration

To earn the Honors Academic Concentration, students must satisfy the following requirements:

- Completion of 20 credits/units of Honors-designated courses
- Completion of a 3-credit/unit Honors capstone course
- 3.50 cumulative GPA
- Concurrent completion of Transfer AA, AST, or AFA degree requirements
